Increase in grammatical complexity & emphasis on signed responses

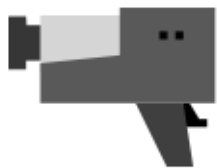
Method of Instruction

Academic Dishonesty

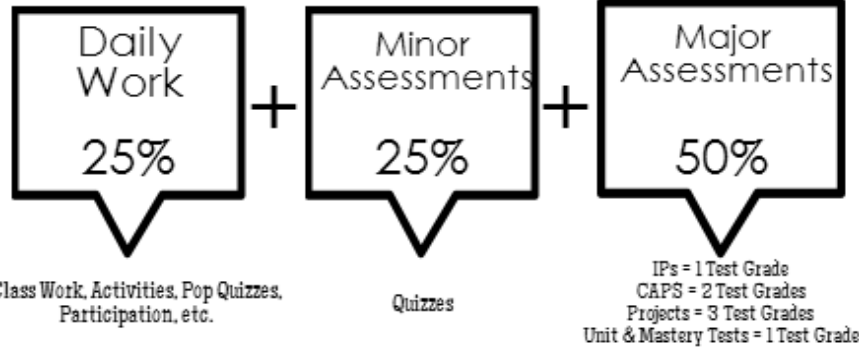
